

Board Meeting ~ A Condensed Version of Unapproved Minutes ~ August 11, 2010

• **Committee reports:** All committee reports will be filed with the minutes.

• **Museum report:** Marjorie reported on Garry's continuing care of the grounds and a visit by the Poling grandchildren. She also let us know that the metal barn in Lafayette will be cleaned out soon and that they need more helpers when that time comes.

• **Photo report:** Two changes were noted on the agreement with Pacific Frame and Gallery. Tami reported on her and her family's disagreement with selling copies of her ancestors' portraits. Theresa had moved and Shirley M had seconded to accept the agreement, but they rescinded the motion, and Carolyn will check on the legalities of this agreement with Jerry Hart.

• **A&E report:** working on mapping out the warehouse for vendor spaces and display areas. At the Heritage Center, Oct. 23 will be a veterans' event and Dec. 4&5 will be the "Handmade Holiday." The A&E committee is working with Mr. Brandt of Yamhill County Planning and Zoning to make sure we are working properly within the zoning limits for the Heritage Center.

• **Harvest Fest:** The information booth took in \$615.00, which included 13 memberships, and sales of hats and the prints donated by Al Cronk. Pam will present a complete report on Harvest Fest at our next meeting Sept. 8.

• **Treasurer's Report:** Kim presented the treasurer's report. Currently we have \$297,036.87 cash on hand.

Unfinished Business:

• Carolyn reported that she is still working on getting a full copy of the **Dr. Marquis Charitable Remainder Trust**.

• **Business Plan:** Each board member was presented with a copy of the first final draft of the YCHS 2011-2015 business plan. We all need to read and study this 63 page document and note any questions, discrepancies, or mistakes. There will be a special meeting just to address this issue.

• **Mail Policy:** Phyllis moved and Karen seconded that we change the policy to store the mail logs in the Lafayette museum and to add the vice president as one of the officers that could pick up and open mail. Passed unanimously. There was a consensus to continue picking up the mail twice a week.

• **Volunteer/Committee/Board Work Session:** Tuesday, August 31, 5:00 at the Heritage Center will be the "Brainstorming/Work Session." We encourage all board members and committee heads and volunteers to attend! There will be food!

• **Certificates of Appreciation:** Theresa submitted all the names that were sent to her. Ken added Steve Cone to the list. Tami moved and Don seconded that we accept the entire list with the addition of Steve Cone. Passed unanimously. Karen will hand letter the certificates for the picnic.

• **Audit Report:** Kellie has begun our audit and expects to have it done by the next board meeting.

New Business:

• **Ad-hoc Nominating Committee:** Phyllis, Marge and Matt are going to form this committee to come up with nominees for the three or four board positions that will be open next year. Our bylaws require a minimum of 9 and a maximum of 15 board members. Our current bylaws went into effect November 11, 2008.

• **Treasures in the Attic** will be September 18, 10-4. Shirley V has formed the committee and the appraisers are lined up.

• **Ad-hoc Governance Committee:** Members include Kim, Don, Shirley V, Ken, Bob, Matt, and Carolyn will chair. Will oversee our upcoming election to see that we follow the bylaws.

• **Restroom and lighting at Heritage Center warehouse:** Even though these have already been installed and paid for, they would have had to have board approval for the project. However, this project was started before the board motion to require board approval of all expenditures. Shirley V moved and Phyllis seconded that we approve the project retroactively. Passed unanimously.

• **Riding Lawn Mower request:** Ursula Doud had donated a used push mower which Garry Coats is currently using. Karen moved and Phyllis seconded that we approve a purchase of a new riding lawn mower with a limit of \$850.00, to be paid for out of the Miller fund. (We still have \$31,000.00 in the Miller Fund but that must last until June 30, 2011 since the fiscal year for that fund is July 1- June 30.) If an appropriate mower cannot be found for that price, Jean and Marge will bring the issue forward again at the September meeting. Passed unanimously. Don and Karen will help with the shopping.

Next Board meeting is Wednesday, September 8, 4:00 at Lafayette.

2010 Harvest Fest a Success!

“Harvest Fest Hits its Stride” says Karl Klooster of the News Register (see article, August 11, 2010 front page, and subsequent article August 14, 2010).

“...Though still a work in progress, on this early August weekend the Center lived up to its promise as the Historical Society’s showcase of a time when most valley inhabitants relied on the land for their livelihood.”

Harvest Fest guests enjoyed two great days of weather and activities on August 7 and 8 as volunteers put on a show with vintage equipment and mules to harvest the field of oats planted on the Heritage Center property. Visitors enjoyed demonstrations in the sawmill and blacksmith shop, as well as stump pulling and wheel setting. People feasted old-fashioned root beer floats as they tapped their toes to music by The Mavericks, Oregon Old-Time Fiddlers, and George and Carolyn Stastny. Others enjoyed talking with the ladies spinning and making lace, as well as looking at antique quilts on display. Local authors were present and shared stories about their books and history of the area. Kids enjoyed dressing up in pioneer clothes, sitting in the covered wagon or in the schoolhouse, and pretending they were part of the pioneers on the Oregon Trail. Many other booths and displays rounded out the Harvest Fest activities, including the dedication of the blacksmith shop on Saturday morning and dedication of the 1912 Peerless Steam Traction Engine on Sunday morning. Dave Cruickshank did a great job as master of ceremonies and announcer for the tractor parade, providing interesting details about the tractors and their owners.

A special thanks to all the volunteers who planned and worked to make this event such a success – without their help, this would not be possible!

Pioneer Recipes: HARDTACK

The Civil War soldiers called hardtack "digestible leather." Put a piece in your stew or chili or dunk it in your drink. Caution should be used. It was not called teeth duller, angel cake, or ammo reserve for nothing. The basic recipe is flour, salt, and water. Some hardtack was used after 35 years. It keeps if kept dry.

2 cups flour
3/4 cup water
3/4 teaspoon salt (optional)

1. Mix ingredients into a dough and press onto a cookie sheet to a thickness of 1/2 inch.
2. Bake at 400 degrees for 30 minutes. Don't cut yet.
3. Remove from oven, cut dough into 3 inch squares. With a fork punch 4 rows of holes, 4 rows per row into the dough.
4. Flip the crackers over and return to oven for 30 minutes more.

There are many different recipes and stories about hardtack. Google "hardtack" and be entertained.
